CUSTOMIZED STUDENT-CENTERED EDUCATION

Through its student-centered interdisciplinary approach, Bancroft includes parents and home school districts in designing each child's Individualized Education Plan (IEP), giving the opportunity to make meaningful and achievable contributions to every child's success.

Our integrated classroom model provides teachers with essential support leading to progressive outcomes and appropriate independence for students. Teachers and clinicians evaluate student progress in "classroom clinics," making real-time adaptations to accommodate the specific needs of each child. Through a carefully thought-out mix of communication, behavioral, educational and vocational programming, we help each student achieve the highest level of independence possible.

Augmentative Communication

The ability to communicate can change the world and is essential for students to learn and adapt to different environments. Bancroft students have access to a variety of technology to support communication and infuse these resources into the classroom. Our Augmentative Communication Specialists work with Speech and Language Therapists to identify the appropriate communication device for each child and then train the student and his or her family to foster successful communication at home and school.





Enrichment BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

More than a classroom, more than a curriculum, students at The Bancroft School are empowered by teachable moments throughout each and every day. Academic instruction goes beyond traditional subjects to include daily living and social skills and experiential learning. The arts play a big role through therapeutic Art, Music and Drama classes, along with Adaptive Physical Education and enrichment activities that are an integral part of the Bancroft experience.

We believe learning also happens in the community. Extracurricular activities and school outings engage students with community members. FAMILY Engagement

Families play an integral role in their child's success at Bancroft. Participation in the child's treatment team, updates on a child's individual progress, open lines of communication about school activities, and abundant opportunities to visit the classroom are all ways in which families play a role in their child's education. Throughout the year, our programs and workshops make experts and resources available to help parents navigate funding, legal and eligibility issues. We also offer opportunities for family members to become involved with PTO, Family Executive Council and volunteer activities.



This comprehensive behavior-based school program located in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, helps children on the autism spectrum ages 3 to 9 to develop and generalize new skills while reducing disruptive behaviors. The individualized plan for each child focuses on their traits, behaviors and what they enjoy learning about, to move on to The Bancroft School or re-integrate into a classroom in their home school district.

THE BANCROFT SCHOOL

A new school built on an engaging and beautiful campus in Mt. Laurel, New Jersey, The Bancroft School features abundant learning, enrichment and recreational activities, vocational skills training, and campus- and community-based residential treatment programs. Children and adolescents ages 9 to 21 learn and grow at The Bancroft School, where the latest technologies and pioneering career and vocational programs are expertly employed. Our highly trained staff and clinicians afford students opportunities to develop the academic, social and behavior skills needed to live life to its fullest potential.

HIGH SCHOOL TRANSITION PROGRAM

Preparation for adult life and responsibilities is critical for a successful transition. Beginning at age 14 and continuing through age 21 and graduation, The Bancroft School's Transition Program prepares students through academic, behavioral and social skills in the classroom and hands-on job preparation. Bancroft students learn the practical jobseeking, social and life skills they will need to transition into the adult community.

As students progress from education entitlements to eligibility-based services for adults upon graduation at age 21, Bancroft social workers walk families through the necessary steps to position every graduate to access adult services and thrive in the least restrictive setting.

LINDENS NEUROBEHAVIORAL PROGRAM

An intensive stabilization program for children and adolescents facing severe behaviors that disrupt family life, education, community recreation and socialization, the Lindens Neurobehavioral Program utilizes evidenced-based practices to reduce the frequency, duration and intensity of problem behaviors, including self-injurious behavior, aggression, and property destruction. The program, located on the Welsh Campus in Mt. Laurel, New Jersey, offers a secure yet home-like setting. Progressive stabilization programming by trained alinicians and support staff is developed to meet each child's unique skills and


