Intensive Outpatient Treatment for Youth Living with Autism

Bancroft's Severe Behavior Day Treatment Program offers intensive clinic-based outpatient treatment for children and young adults ages 3-21 who are living with autism and experiencing severe behaviors – such as, aggression, self-injury, pica, or property destruction – that are interrupting their daily lives, impeding learning and preventing engagement in the community.



Based on the principles of Applied

Behavior Analysis (ABA), the Bancroft Severe Behavior Day Treatment Program incorporates evidence-based behavioral assessment, intervention, and parent training in a clinically-rich environment.

Stabilization for Reintegration

The goal of the program is to reintegrate the child to their school and community. Therapies are provided by Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs) and Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs) and overseen by doctoral level BCBAs with expertise in treating severe challenging behavior.



Full-day (6 hours) and half-day (3 hours) options are available, depending on the needs of the child. The average duration of the treatment program is estimated at 12 weeks.

Frequently Asked Questions

What can I expect from the program?

The Severe Behavior Day Treatment Program is a highly-specialized, clinically-rich program designed to meet the unique needs of each child. Therapies are provided by RBTs, BCBAs overseen by doctoral level BCBAs in private treatment rooms with the goal of behavior reduction and return to the child's daily routine.

How long may a child be treated through the program?

This program requires on average 12 weeks depending on the needs of your child, and whether your child is enrolled in the full-day or half-day program.

Is the program covered by insurance?

Services may be covered by your health insurance or school district.
