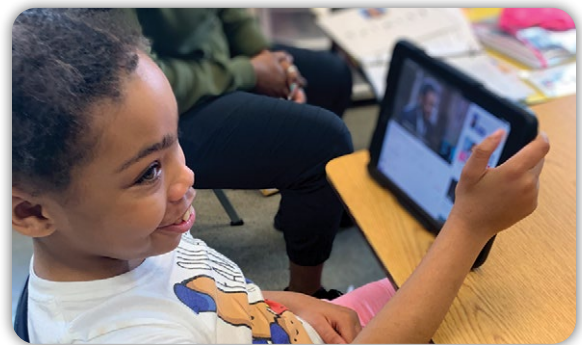
We will change the lives of those we support, their families, our team members and the people in our industry.

Achievements

- In partnership with the A.J. Drexel Autism Institute, received an Autism Science Foundation grant examining the relationship between self-injurious behavior and medical conditions in people with profound autism
- Collaborating with Rowan University on a number of initiatives involving tech innovation and health and well-being and seeking grant opportunities to fund these priorities



LEVERAGE TECHNOLOGY

By leveraging technology, we will engage the individuals we support and our team members in dynamic ways and advance the organization's strategic advantage.

Achievements

- Secured \$500,000 from the NJ Division of Developmental Disabilities to pilot smart homes in select group homes designed to enable the highest level of independence possible, improve safety and increase staff efficiency
- Awarded an additional \$500,000 from the Administration for Community Living to incorporate cutting-edge assistive technology in select adult day programs and group homes to foster a greater sense of empowerment, engagement and independence



SIGNIFICANTLY GROW BANCROFT

Achievements

- Established The Bancroft School Network, acquiring Kohler Academy in Mountainside, NJ, and increasing capacity at the Preschool & Early Education Program to expand access to students who need our services
- Opened six new group homes to meet the increased need for residential placement and expand access to more individuals and their families in need of services



TRANSFORM THE EMPLOYEE EXPERIENCE

- Opened the new Employee Center in Moorestown, NJ, creating a resource hub for team members and improving the experience of candidates and new hires

From selecting the perfect snack and making sure everyone gets a turn at checking the mail to putting on large-scale CRSA socials and family BBQs, there is never a dull moment in the house.

You can often hear the fun before you walk in; music will be playing for a dance party in the living room, which will be decorated for the latest holiday or special occasion!

The residents and staff members at Burrs have created strong bonds over the last few years, thanks in part to the consistency of the team, many of whom have been working together for over four years. The team is dedicated to developing a true understanding of each woman in their care, helping them achieve their goals and realize their passions.

Julie is a social butterfly with an inquisitive personality who grasps everyone's attention and has lived at Bancroft for 14 years! She loves getting to know people and can remember even the smallest details shared.

Making a House a Home



In 2017, Tad Ritter and Andrew Parker co-founded Nestidd, a company dedicated to providing safe, customized homes for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). They partner with care providers and help them locate, renovate and customize suitable homes in safe neighborhoods. Nestidd owns over 1,000 properties across the United States, ensuring those with I/DD have safe, accessible homes where they can thrive.

Tad and Andrew wanted to take their vision even further by helping residents feel like their house is more comfortable and personalized, more like home. Together, they brainstormed what that meant to each of them and they established Plantidd. Plantidd is a mission-driven organization that provides beds, plants, tools and other garden materials to residents living in supported homes, beautifying the outside with pretty and welcoming landscapes.



By donating everything needed for a flower bed or green space,

Plantidd provides a physical activity to help grow the feeling of home within each supported house.

They also supply enrichment opportunities for group home staff and residents so they can work together to plant and nurture something beautiful. They provide all of the necessary garden supplies and do all of the initial labor – including building the garden beds and laying down the soil in preparation for planting.

To date, Plantidd has created over 100 gardens at six different organizations, including Bancroft. Last spring, they equipped multiple Bancroft group homes with picturesque gardens for the residents to tend, water and watch grow in their own backyards. They also built raised beds, providing accessibility without barriers for individuals who use wheelchairs. Experiencing the gardens firsthand has brought joy and a sense of pride to Bancroft's residents. They socialize with housemates, working together to care for their garden. Plantidd has helped so many individuals in Bancroft's care and beyond feel at home with a quiet, outdoor respite space in their very own gorgeous gardens.

Transforming Care



Salem Health & Wellness
Foundation



Since 2015, the Salem Health & Wellness Foundation (SHWF) has partnered with Bancroft to make a difference in the lives of the individuals supported on the beautiful Lakeside Campus in Mullica Hill, NJ. With the Foundation's support, Bancroft has created spaces and opportunities to make each day more meaningful, transforming Lakeside into an all-in-one center for Bancroft in Salem County.

As a result of this fruitful partnership, Bancroft opened a wellness center to provide on-site medical care, an outdoor fitness center to encourage daily movement and exercise, and a "stress-less" center for team members to reboot and recharge during breaks, complete with a full private bathroom, a small kitchen and plush, comfortable seating. Most recently, two masters-level social work student interns and a Licensed Clinical Social Worker joined the team to provide mental health care services to residents.



These additions to the Lakeside Campus have helped cultivate holistic wellness among the men and women who call it home, as well as the dedicated team members.



The Salem Health & Wellness Foundation has been promoting the holistic wellness of Salem County residents for 22 years. Last year, longtime Bancroft champion and SHWF Executive Director, Brenda Goins, celebrated her retirement after 19 years of leadership. In her role, Brenda was a steadfast supporter of Bancroft, helping transform whole-person care at the Lakeside Campus. In 2023, SHWF named a new Executive Director, Paul DiLorenzo, to carry on their mission. With over 40 years of experience in child welfare and family support programs, we are excited about this new chapter with Paul at the helm and look forward to future wellness initiatives and partnerships.

Philanthropy in Action

Arts in Healing

Bancroft received a grant from dedicated partner TD Charitable Foundation to support the Arts in Healing program, a meaningful collaboration between Bancroft and Perkins Center for the Arts. This program aims to increase access to community-based arts and cultural events for adults supported by Bancroft. A multi-month series, this program provided immersive arts experiences for participants in Bancroft adult day programs. Diverse opportunities like cooking and baking classes, pottery, music exploration and dance engaged many individuals and removed barriers to these experiences. Philadelphia muralist, Ali Williams, collaborated at the Jacob Schaefer Center adult day program in Cherry Hill, NJ, to create a community mural that will bring excitement and color to the outside space.

The TD Charitable Foundation has supported Bancroft in a variety of programs and events for nearly 15 years, and the Arts in Healing program is an incredible result of this committed corporate partnership.



A Bundle of Joye!

With the help of donor support, including a lead gift from the Shreiber Animal Foundation Enterprise, The Bancroft School at Voorhees Pediatric Facility welcomed Joye in the spring of 2023. Together with her handler Cara, an education supervisor, the inseparable pair leads the Canine Classmate program. This program is designed to provide social, emotional and therapeutic support and promote a positive and nurturing learning environment for students. Research shows the positive impact animals have on children, especially those in education and nursing care facilities. Working with Joye reduces stress and anxiety and decreases heart rate and blood pressure. Joye is a two-year-old lab-golden mix who completed her training with Canine Companions™ in early 2023 and is Bancroft's second canine-assisted therapy dog, joining Dave, who works in Bancroft NeuroRehab.



Joye also helps the Bancroft and VPF teachers and staff, elevating their moods and lowering the stressors that can come along with a tough workday. Follow along Joye's journey on Instagram @pawsofjoye!

Providing Opportunities for **Enrichment**

Seeing and understanding various needs across the organization, NJM Insurance Group helped elevate two programs at Bancroft through diverse grants this year. In Spring 2023, they generously helped fund brand new uniforms and various equipment supporting Bancroft's Special Olympics teams. The Special Olympics provides a platform for individuals with autism and I/DD to showcase their abilities, fostering self-esteem, social inclusion and physical fitness. Through the generosity of NJM Insurance Group, Bancroft Special Olympics athletes are hitting the field this season with vibrant new uniforms and confidence to match.

True philanthropic partners who believe in Bancroft's mission, NJM also funded a grant providing sensory equipment for the Preschool & Early Education Program. Equipment includes squeeze seats, scooters, a musical touch wall, a sand table and more that students use to nurture emotional regulation and safely express their feelings.

Integrated **Arts and Employment** Program at Saddlehill

In April 2023, Bancroft partnered with Saddlehill to offer an immersive horticultural education to adult day program participants. Under the ownership of Bill Green, the land in Voorhees, NJ, is undergoing a remarkable transformation featuring lush gardens and thriving vineyards. Eager to open this space to the community, Green collaborated with Sprouting Connections to make a generous contribution to Bancroft.

Bancroft's Integrated Arts and Employment Program at Saddlehill provides learning opportunities through horticulture and enrichment. Beginning this year, a small group of program participants planted herbs, vegetables and flowers and prepared the greenhouse which they will continue to maintain. This program offers a unique learning opportunity for individuals in day programs to continue to grow and discover interests and passions with the goal of providing employment opportunities in the future.

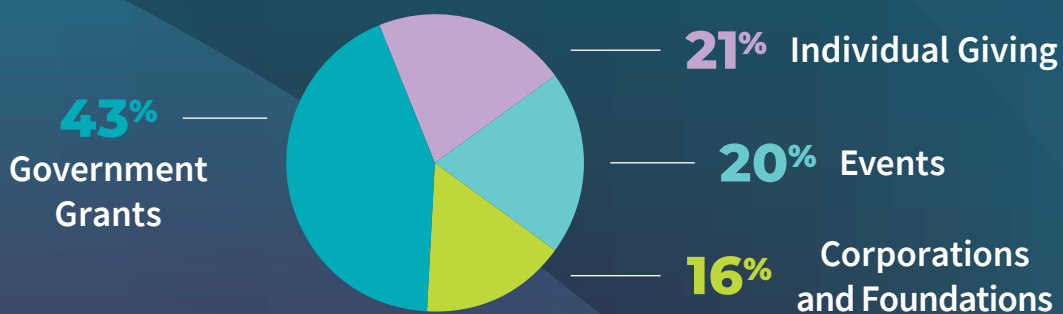
