

Autism & I/DD: Changing Demographics, Rising Needs

Why This Matters

The needs of individuals with autism and intellectual or developmental disabilities (I/DD) are changing rapidly. Higher rates of profound autism, more complex medical and behavioral challenges, and a growing aging population mean that providers, families, and healthcare systems must prepare now for the future.

National Statistics

- It is estimated that approximately 2.1% of adults in the United States have autism. Older individuals are less likely to have received a diagnosis.
- Adults with autism and I/DD have almost 5x more annual health care spending
- Adults with autism are up to 3x more likely to **develop dementia**; as many as 1 in 3 may be affected
- Autistic individuals are at greater risk for many health conditions. Individuals with profound autism-- requiring 24 hr support- are at even greater risk for sleep disorders, cardiovascular disease, respiratory disorders, and gastrointestinal disorders

Bancroft by the Numbers

- Approximately 20% of individuals in Bancroft's residential programs are over age 40
- 6% are age 65+
- 75% of Bancroft's adult population has an autism diagnosis
- Nearly half (44%) have a co-occurring mental health condition
- 93% of children admitted to Bancroft have experienced trauma prior to admission
- Bancroft residents see a large number of medical specialties, with an average of 9 appointments annually

Trends We Are Seeing

- Rising prevalence of profound autism: Children admitted now often present with multiple psychiatric and medical diagnoses, and many will remain in services into adulthood.
- **Higher acuity in admissions:** Adults entering care require more intensive supports than even 5 years ago.
- **Growing older adult population:** Individuals are living longer, but often with more health needs — from mobility issues to dementia.
- Healthcare as a primary challenge: Medical issues are now the top reason for discharges from aging programs.

- Research & Grants: Advancing studies on profound autism, health, and mental health.
- Healthcare Partnerships: Mobile clinic with Cooper, Inclusive Wellness Center with Rowan & Virtua.
- National Conversations: Roundtables and seminar series on aging, dementia, and autism.
