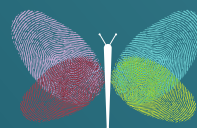

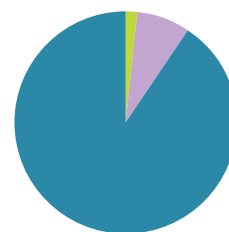


Advancing Our Strategic Plan

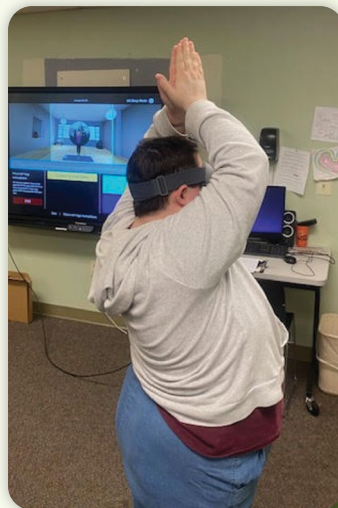
Inspire Clinical Excellence

Healthcare on Wheels: Cooper Mobile Clinic Arrives at Bancroft

Bringing care where it's needed most, the new Cooper Mobile Clinic provides onsite health screenings, sick and well visits, and preventive care for individuals supported by Bancroft. The clinic, funded through a grant provided to Cooper, travels to Bancroft group homes and day programs and provides accessible and individualized medical care in familiar environments. By conducting exams in familiar environments with the support of trusted caregivers, patients experience less anxiety and greater success in receiving the care they deserve.

Where Calm and Joy Begin: The Lindens Sensory Room

For the 32 children and young adults living at Bancroft's Lindens Neurobehavioral Program (the Lindens), having a safe, calming environment is a vital part of working toward independence, personal growth, and ultimately, an improved quality of life.

Sensory processing disorders and sensory processing dysfunction are very common among the students at the Lindens, and a need for a dedicated sensory room was evident.



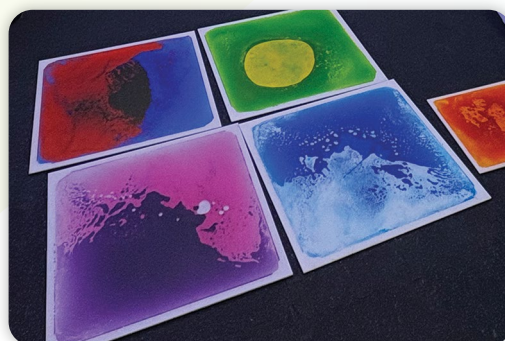

The newly designed space provides an area where each individual can practice self-regulation, sensory integration, and emotional coping strategies.

The room features a variety of specialized tools and equipment – such as weighted blankets, soft lighting, tactile panels, and motion-based activities – that help those who struggle with sensory processing. Whether they need a moment to refocus or are working with staff on tailored exercises, the sensory room offers a critical resource for supporting emotional well-being and academic readiness.

A Taste of Wellness: Lunchtime Energize at Gloucester Day

At Bancroft's Gloucester Day & Employment Program, lunchtime has taken on a whole new meaning. Thanks to the support of The Wawa Foundation and a unique partnership with Rowan University, adults with autism and intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) are discovering that healthy living can be fun, delicious and empowering.



The new program, *Lunchtime Energize*, brings together nutrition education and physical activity in ways that meet the unique needs of each participant. From cooking sessions to creative fitness classes, the program is designed to make wellness both accessible and enjoyable.

For many, these lessons are life-changing. Individuals with I/DD face higher risks of diabetes and hypertension, and barriers such as sensory sensitivities and limited food preferences often make eating well and exercising more challenging. *Lunchtime Energize* tackles these barriers head-on, giving participants the chance to try new foods, learn practical cooking skills, and find movement they truly enjoy. One recent favorite? Baked broccoli cheddar bites – a recipe that had the group asking for seconds. “I never thought I’d like broccoli, but these are good!” one individual shared with a smile.



Rowan University dietitians and exercise science students work side-by-side with Bancroft's own dietitian, Robert Trombley, to guide these sessions. Together, they not only prepare healthy meals but also introduce new approaches to fitness, including virtual reality apps that make exercise engaging and interactive.

Behind it all is a shared commitment. “Supporting the health and wellness of our communities is at the heart of what we do,” said Liz Simeone, President of The Wawa Foundation. “We’re honored to help Bancroft expand opportunities for individuals with disabilities to live healthier, more active lives.”

For Bancroft, the vision extends far beyond the lunch table. “Through this partnership, we’re addressing health and wellness in a way that is accessible, meaningful, and empowering for each person,” said Karen Lindgren, Bancroft's Chief Clinical Officer.



With each meal prepared and each fitness class completed, participants are gaining more than knowledge – they’re building confidence, independence, and healthier habits that can last a lifetime.

Bridging Care and Innovation: Meet Pepper, the Humanoid Robot

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, Bancroft has taken an exciting step forward in supporting older adults with autism and intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). We are thrilled to announce that Bancroft has purchased its very own Pepper robot – an artificially intelligent (AI) social robot designed to engage, stimulate, and delight residents.



Pepper, standing just over four feet tall, has already begun creating meaningful moments for residents at the Judith B. Flicker Residences. Program participants, ranging in age from their 60s to 80s, interact with Pepper through games, music, and guided activities that encourage both cognitive engagement and physical movement. From “Name That Song” to impromptu dance parties, Pepper brings energy, joy, and companionship to daily life.



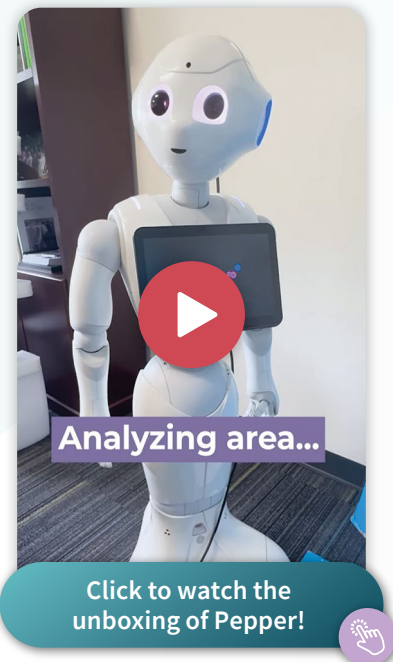
This innovative technology is part of a pilot project in partnership with Saint Joseph’s University, aimed at exploring how AI can support aging adults with autism. Many adults with autism and I/DD face unique challenges as they age, including changes in cognitive function and social interaction.



By introducing Pepper into our residential programs, Bancroft is advancing research on healthy aging for this population, while offering residents a new source of connection, fun, and engagement.

“Pepper provides an unexpected but wonderful sense of joy and companionship for our residents,” said Karen Lindgren, Chief Clinical Officer at Bancroft. “It’s not a replacement for human interaction, but it is a remarkable supplement that brings smiles, engagement, and movement into their daily routines.”

The support of our donors has made this milestone possible, enabling Bancroft to invest in cutting-edge technology that enhances the lives of those we support. With Pepper on-site, residents at Flicker can look forward to a new era of interactive experiences – combining engagement, learning, and social connection in ways never before possible.



Digital Skills, Real Opportunities: *MoveUp Program* at The Bancroft School

With the generous support of the PwC Charitable Foundation's Reimagine Grant, The Bancroft School launched the *MoveUp Program* – a groundbreaking initiative designed to prepare young adults with autism and intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) for greater independence and meaningful employment. Over the course of one year, students at The Bancroft School between the ages of 18 and 21 participated in technology-driven lessons and vocational training that helped bridge the critical gap between high school and adulthood.



Every student in the program received weekly, hands-on instruction in internet safety, smart device use, and digital communication. By year's end, participants showed measurable improvements in their digital literacy skills and demonstrated increased proficiency in using smart devices – tools that promoted not only independence but also self-reliance in daily life.

The *MoveUp Program* didn't stop at the classroom door. Students also practiced real-world job skills – training on point-of-sale systems, workplace software, and communication tools used in professional settings. Some students participated in mock interviews and workplace simulations, while



others took part in real-world vocational training through community partnerships with a thrift shop, gym, and pizza restaurant. For many, it was their first chance to picture themselves in a workplace – and to realize they belonged there.



Thanks to the PwC Charitable Foundation's Reimagine Grant, the *MoveUp Program* is more than a set of classes or job rotations – it's a turning point. It's a young woman texting her mom to say she'll be home on time. It's a young man running a cash register with confidence. It's young adults taking their next steps into adulthood with the skills to thrive in today's digital and vocational landscapes, not with hesitation, but with hope.

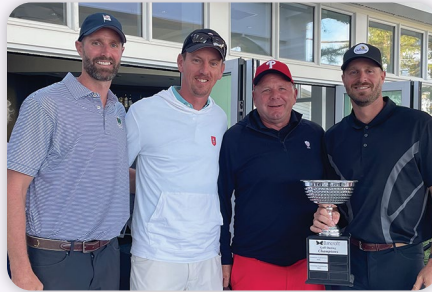

Planned Gifts

There are a variety of ways that you can support Bancroft with a planned gift. We encourage you to seek the advice of your financial planner and/or attorney to ensure that the gift is right for you.

You can make your gift through:

- **Wills and Trusts:** You can include written instructions directing that a percentage or specific dollar amount be gifted to Bancroft.
- **Retirement Assets:** You can designate Bancroft as a partial or full beneficiary of your IRA, 401(k), 403(b) or another tax-deferred plan.
- **Life Insurance Policy:** You can designate Bancroft as a partial or full beneficiary of your insurance policy.
