Day Programs and Residential Services for Adults

Transitioning to Adulthood Doesn't Mean Doing Everything Alone

With the right supports in place, adult life can be structured, meaningful, and full of opportunity.

Graduation marks the beginning of a new phase, one where supports shift from school-based services to adult programs focused on community life, independence, and long-term stability.

At Bancroft, we encourage families, guardians, and support coordinators to begin planning early so services can be in place when school ends.



What Is a Day Program?

Bancroft's day programs support adults living with autism and intellectual disabilities with a focus on meaningful participation in the community.

Programs provide consistent daytime supports as individuals build routines, relationships, and adult skills. Services are individualized, recognizing that adulthood looks different for everyone.

Day program experiences may include:

- Vocational exploration and employment readiness
- Community outings, volunteering, and social participation
- Daily living skill development and self-advocacy
- Structured routines that support independence and confidence

Living Options: Residential Supports for Adult Life

For some adults, continuing to live at home remains the right fit. For others, residential supports become an important part of adult independence.

Bancroft offers a range of residential options for adults with autism and intellectual disabilities, designed to support safety, dignity, and increasing independence.

Programs include group homes and apartments across New Jersey, with support tailored to individual needs, from 24/7 supervision to highly independent living.

Supports may include assistance with hygiene, cooking, cleaning, shopping, medical coordination, and medication management. Nurse case managers oversee health needs.

Individuals participate in day or vocational programs and share household responsibilities while enjoying recreation and community activities with housemates.

- Ocean County (apartments only)

For Adults with Complex Behavioral or Medical Needs

Some adults require more intensive support. Bancroft offers specialized residential programs designed to safely meet higher levels of behavioral or medical complexity.

Lakeside Intensive Residential Program SALEM COUNTY

Designed for adults with complex behavioral needs, Lakeside includes campus-based and community homes with continuous staffing. Programs include intensive Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), community integration, and vocational activities.

Medically Acute and PICA Group Homes GLOUCESTER COUNTY


These homes support adults with complex medical needs, including feeding tubes, ostomy care, and chronic conditions. Round-the-clock nursing is provided while encouraging independence whenever possible.





Where We Serve Across New Jersey

Bancroft offers day and residential programs in multiple New Jersey counties. Availability and level of support are determined through individualized assessment and DDD funding.

Support needs evolve over time. Our teams focus on continuity, communication, and long-term planning so caregivers can feel confident about their loved one's support, not just today, but years into the future.

Integrated services may include:

- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)
- Occupational, physical, and speech therapy
- Nurse case management
- Vocational training and employment support
- Psychiatry
- Behavioral planning

Together, these services support continued progress toward independence, stability, and meaningful community participation.





Planning Ahead for Adult Services

Unlike school-based services, adult supports are funded through the [New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities \(DDD\)](#).

DDD uses evaluations to determine eligibility and appropriate levels of support based on an individual's ability to function safely and independently in the community.

Starting the process early helps prevent gaps in services and creates more options at graduation.
